Drop Box Restrictions

Drop boxes *are not* to be used for the disposal of (a) needles or any type of “sharps”, (b) illegal or illicit drugs or substances or (c) medical or non-medical hazardous waste.

Safe Needle and Sharps Disposal

Needles/sharps can be disposed of in regular trash collection after they have been packaged in rigid, sealed, labeled and leak-proof containers, e.g. laundry detergent bottles or metal coffee cans.

- Securely label the container with “Infectious Waste” or “Biohazard Waste”
- Seal the container using strong tape
- Contact your waste hauler to explain how you will be disposing of your sharps/needles and confirm that they will accept these items.
